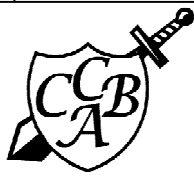

Greetings from your Vineyard!

So much has been happening at The Vineyard. We have had so many mission teams and local volunteers helping lately that more has happened than can be mentioned in this article! It has been an exciting place to be around. The Lord has been blessing in so many ways and so many people have really come out in support that it has been wonderful to see all that is and has been happening. In fact, as you read this, we should be in the midst of our last mission team for the summer. And, summer camps should have officially come to a close.

It has lights and AC working, but still needs paint on the walls and a drop ceiling installed. We recently forged a road around the top side of the big lake (Lake Galilee) to the location of two more future cabin spots. Also, additions have been added to the barn and workshop. We are real near having power to the workshop. The two cottages have undergone some renovations and paint jobs - making them much nicer than they previously were.

We have managed also to build a new outdoor amphitheatre (of sorts). To allow groups the opportunity of holding more outdoor meetings and singings, we built the outdoor stage into a kind-of amphitheatre-type structure that resembles an old-timey cypress log cabin (kind of like a hillbilly home). In fact, the old wash tub that hangs on the front of the cabin is the very one that Steve and his Tennessee family bathed in until he was in the seventh grade (when they got indoor plumbing). So there are some authentic hillbilly artifacts there. Groups have enjoyed using it so far. Electricity is on at the stage, but some additional wiring still needs to be done.

Additional recreational items we now offer to guests are roller racers. The Vineyard owns 16 of these neat roller skate-style riding carts that guests may use in the gym. Lots of groups have taken advantage of these so far. Plus, the Vineyard store now has Dippin' Dots. Kids of all ages love these very frozen treats!

The CCBA children's and youth camp was a great success. We had right at 100 in attendance (counting campers and counselors). Wow, what a number. We thank all the churches that participated in our camp. Thanks also to Kerry & Elizabeth Mitchell, and Lester & Vicky Rachel for leading these camps.

We cannot finish an article without mentioning our summer missionaries. We have had a great bunch this summer. To mention names - Jared Buchanan, Kayla Smith, Clay Eagerton, Michael Sawka, Erica Willis, Erica Vick, Sarah Davis, and Audrey Doggett. They have been a lot of fun and a big help all summer with all the tasks required of running camps. Thanks guys!

It would be nearly impossible to remember all the folks who have recently helped us with various projects and tasks, but we will mention the Sanders family for coming to help us get the foundation of cabin #2 finished and for pulling the concrete truck out of the mud. Hardly a week goes by that we don't get some type of assistance from the individual members of our committee. Thanks for being a great committee.
